TRUSTED SERVANT REPORTS:

Regional Committee Member: Chris K. (*present*) – The drive to Marquette, Michigan was very beautiful and long! We discovered that pasties are not coverings for female strippers’ anatomy, but rather a type of “hot pocket” sandwich in the north and pronounces with a short “a”.

1) Financial: WRSC donated \$1,670.64 to NAWS last cycle. WRSC donated \$556.54 to the Midwest Zonal Forum last cycle.

2) Service Office: **A)** There are 5 new service pamphlets available: Introduction To NA Meetings, Trusted Servants, Disruptive Behavior and Violence in the Group, Business Meetings, & Groups and Medications. (All should be available soon on the World Website.) **B)** The new PR guidebook is also available for \$8.50. **C)** The 6th Edition Basic Text Draft is available by download (free) or paper (\$8.50). It will be included in the CAR as a yes / no vote. No further input or revisions.

3) H&I: Please submit H&I reports to Tony by e-mail prior to the next Region. He is having difficulty getting reports from ASCs. Let us know if you need his e-mail address.

4) PR: Groups need to register with World in order to keep the on-line information up to date with NAWS. The Women in Recovery Conference went well. The Mental Health / Substance Abuse Conference is Monday. A PR Learning Day was held in Chicago, Illinois on September 08, 2007. Would we like to do something similar in our Region?

5) Round Table: Discussed how to get members involved in service at all levels. Youth in recovery discussion held over until next cycle.

6) Elections: Open positions: Additional Needs, Literature, Secretary, WSNAC BOD, WSNAC pool, WRSO pool, & H&I – Tony nominated.

7) Fund Disbursement: Change web hosting from one (1) year to three (3) years contract to reduce cost. RD team budget was presented, but after questions, will be adjusted and re-presented next cycle.

8) Discussion / Motions: **A)** Motion to increase mileage from \$0.15 to \$0.25 per mile was carried. **B)** Motion to increase participant expenditure from \$50.00 to \$100.00 per cycle was set aside. All participants are to track their expenditures over the next 4 cycles so that an accurate amount can be set for the reimbursement. **Q:** Why does Region need a participant expenditure reimbursement? **A:** While most Areas can afford to send their RCMs and RCMAs, the Trusted Servants of Region do not get any reimbursement. **C)** Deb W. and Chris K. will be working on cleaning up policy to make it more in line with how things happen, change in voting procedures, etc. **D)** Meeting list subcommittee still working on how to put into policy how meetings get on the meeting list, especially meetings that are not affiliated with an Area. **E)** RSC agreed to WSNAC’s request to send a participant to Literature / Convention Workshop in California if WSNAC is able to fully fund this.

Literature Review: (*open*) –

Hospitals & Institutions: Mike C. (*present*) – We met with PR on September 15, 2007. Currently working with various groups. We are getting a panel ready for Mercy Hospital in Beloit, Wisconsin. Waiting to here from PHASE – Rockford. Waiting to here from Mary, after she talks to Dale at Rosecrance, about forming a Women's H&I Panel.

Public Relations: Rob K. (*present*) – P.R. activity for the month of September 2007:

1) Additional Subcommittee Meeting: Held September 15, 2007 at Freedom To Grow; a total of seven (7) were in attendance. **Summary In Brief:** **A)** Reported to Committee on September 09, 2007 ASC activity. **B)** Reviewed numerous open action items, which need to be closed. (Main body of report includes the current status.) **C)** Delegated some facility contact and literature distribution activities to PR members.

2) Helpline: PR Chair called the answering service inquiring as to why they were not rotating through the volunteers. The answering service is still pending on the purchase of software to automate this function. In the meantime, they will reinforce their efforts to keep track and to rotate calls.

3) Facility Activities: **A) Mercy Hospital (Beloit, Wis.):** Continued e-mails with staff (follow up from July and September contacts), requesting a PR presentation and if possible set up an H&I panel. Tentative date for meeting is October 12, 2007. **B) Rosecrance Adolescent (Rockford, Ill.):** No responses to attempts at phone contact. PR Committee member took an action item to write a letter to the facility. **C) PHASE (Rockford, Ill.):** Facility was to work directly with H&I. H&I Committee member took an action item to contact the facility and begin to set up an H&I Panel. **D) Rockford Rescue Mission:** Responded to a request for contact from this facility. PR Chair left a message on the staff contact's voice-mail. Call has not been returned. **E) Sleazer House (Freeport Adolescent Facility):** Responded to a request for contact

from this facility. PR Chair left a message on the staff contact's voice-mail. Call has not been returned. **F) Stephenson, Rock, and Boone County Jails:** PR Chair got jail contact information from respective websites and prepared a PR Letter for each of these facilities. Letters were mailed on September 27, 2007, no responses yet. **G) Sterling Area Facilities:** Lutheran Social Services (both Sterling and Dixon locations); Sinnissippi Centers (both Sterling and Dixon locations) – In response to Reality Check members request to investigate H&I work in the Sterling area, PR Chair got staff contact information from respective websites and prepared a PR Letter for each of these facilities. Letters were mailed on October 03, 2007, too soon for any responses.

4) Public Service Announcements (PSAs): A second (better quality) copy of the masters for the PSAs was received. A PR Committee member took the action item to work with local television stations on post-production required to add local information and distribute to stations and the cable company. The member reports that PSAs should be running soon on the cable company and one (1) broadcast station, with copies going out to others. Once they are running, it would probably be good form to follow up with a "Thankyou letter". (PR Chair has the action item to do this.)

5) Meeting Directories: PR has printed updated meeting directories. GSRs please take some back to your groups!

6) P.R. (Action – Rob K.) b) PHASE (Belvidere – Evenings) – (contact information?)

7) Monthly Mid-Month P.R. Subcommittee Meeting: The PR Subcommittee meets in conjunction with H&I on the third (3rd) Saturday of every month. The next combined PR / H&I meeting is Saturday October 20, 2007 at Freedom To Grow @ 11:00 am.

8) Committee Activity Prior to the October ASC: October 07, 2007 @ Noon (5 in attendance): Had an informal discussion of current activities. **A) PHASE – Rockford:** H&I is working directly with facility to establish a time slot for H&I Panel presentation. **B) Mercy Hospital (Beloit, Wis.):** H&I has been in contact with "Home Group" to gather members for potential H&I Panel. **C) Sterling area:** Discussed Sterling facility contacts with members from the Sterling area.

PR literature order for this month is \$22.10. In addition, PR distributed copies of the Illinois Clean Air Act that goes into effect January 01, 2008 to the GSRs.

What to expect at an NA meeting: *Although meetings may be located at a variety of publicly accessible buildings, meeting locations do not imply affiliation.*

Meetings use a variety of formats such as Participation, Speaker, Topic Discussion, Book Study, New Comer, Question and Answer, etc. Find a meeting that fits your needs.

There are no attendance monitors at meetings and we are under no surveillance at any time.

Most meetings last from 1 to 1 ½ hours.

When you arrive at your first meeting, you can expect to see recovering addicts welcoming each other and socializing. It is not uncommon for new members to be warmly welcomed.

*You may see information pamphlets, books and activity flyers. Feel free to take pamphlets and flyers. **Books are for sale at cost.***

The leader typically will open the meeting with a moment of silence followed by readings and announcements. The leader will then ask if newcomers and visitors would like to introduce themselves. Participation in meetings is voluntary.

The leader opens up the meeting for members to speak on any subject related to recovery.

*Members will speak, sharing their experience, strength and hope. Sharing is voluntary. We do not respond to other people’s shares (**as in conversation**) but from his or her own experience.*

While members are sharing, we refrain from side conversations and other distracting activities that may disrupt the meeting.

There are no fees or dues to attend a NA meeting. We are self-supporting through our own contributions. You will see a basket being passed, to collect donations from members to pay rent for the meeting place, purchase literature, refreshments, etc.

As Narcotics Anonymous continues to grow as a worldwide fellowship, we have found it difficult to obtain and keep suitable meeting locations.

With that in mind, we ask that members please:

- 1. Be quiet when arriving and departing from meeting facilities.**
- 2. Remember that others may be offended by our tone and language.**
- 3. Dispose of trash and cigarette butts appropriately.**

This letter has helped to pave the way for the new NA member. Also, please get your group’s or subcommittee’s fliers to me so that I may post them on the www.rragsna.org website. Always grateful to be of service, Eric B.
