TRUSTED SERVANT REPORTS:

Regional Committee Member: Chris K. (present) – The WRSC was held March 15 – 16, 2008 in Appleton, Wisconsin. **1) Treasurer:** Last sessions donations were \$2,874.31! November's donations were at a low of \$559.44. We were able to donate to World \$215.57 and to MZF \$71.85.

2) Regional Delegate: Regional Delegate attended the CAR Workshop / MZF Forum in Kalamazoo, Michigan. It was well attended and a good time was had by most. There was a great dissemination of ideas and opinions. RRAGS gave the RD the votes from our area as well as discussion question information.

3) Service Office: New merchandise items for sale include some new style double book covers and a new color (pink!), several new tri-plate and bronze medallions, new bronze keytags, and knitted hats.

All orders after July 01, 2008 must be on the new form with new prices!!! In anticipation of the price increase on July 1st 2008, all Literature Order Forms and inventory forms have been updated with the costs that will go into effect on that date. The price increases that go into effect July 01, 2008 include: *Twelve Concepts of NA Service* - \$1.75; *Group booklet, Behind The Walls, In times of Illness* - \$0.81 / \$0.70; *IP #25, Self Support Principle & Practice* - \$0.48 / \$0.46; *Keytags* - \$0.45; *Medallions* - \$2.75; *Wallet Cards, Readings* - \$2.25; *Group Reading Cards* - \$4.00; *Small Posters* - \$1.25; *Large Posters* - \$2.85; *Poster Set* - \$8.60. To repeat an earlier report – the Basic Journal (we currently have 5), Sluggfest (we currently have 2), the large and small PI posters, and individual audio tapes will be discontinued by the WSO when the current stock is depleted.

4) Financial Status: Literature Inventory (at cost) - \$23,440.00; Merchandise Inventory (at cost) - \$20,035.73; Status with CSO - \$13,737.72; Accounts Receivable - \$4,277.61; Accounts Payable - \$174.46; Funds in WRSO / Bank - \$104.47. TOTAL \$33,736.69.

5) WSNAC: Rand gave reports for Cindy. The issue of CD's was discussed and we are looking to Region to proceed – or not. The Chair of WSNAC BOD is willing to come to RRAGS to answer any questions we may have. We need to set aside time for him when GSRs will be present. The CD issue, which will be for approximately \$15,000.00, was tabled for areas to give input. If we want to meet with him, we need to schedule him to come to the next ASC if we are to get questions answered and have information needed to vote at the May WRSC. On CDs – no exact figures, they think they can raise approximately \$400.00 before the \$15,000.00 will be used again. (3-6 month CD)

6) H&I: I haven't been receiving any reports from areas! Haven't received a call back for the MSDF Facility downtown. I still have no active subcommittee. Please contact the Regional H&I Chairperson, Tony H. – halawt2004@sbcglobal.net or phone 414 – 736 – 0983.

7) Additional Needs: Making contacts and getting information about services available in meetings for those with needs. Appendix II Self Diagnostic Additional Needs Accessibility Questionnaire – the following questions are designed to help your group evaluate accessibility for addicts with additional needs. **a)** Does your meeting place have clearly marked, easily accessible parking spaces reserved? **b)** Is your meeting facility equipped with adequate ramps? **c)** Are parking lots and walkways well lit? **d)** Are all doors (gates, etc.) wide enough for a wheelchair to pass through? **e)** Are elevators available to access meeting rooms not on the main floor? **f)** Are restrooms accessible? **g)** Is your group willing to allow an interpreter to accompany a deaf person in both open and closed meetings? If your group has answered “yes” to all seven (7) questions, then you can consider your meeting accessible.

Tentatively we are scheduling as follows: August – Picnic on August 09, 2008; October – Halloween Dance on Friday October 31, 2008 (possible move to November 01, 2008); December – Gratitude Dinner on Saturday December 13, 2008 (tentatively at Home Group @ RVC-Janesville); February – Valentine Dance on Saturday February 14, 2009; May – Spring Dance on weekend of May 15/16 or May 22/23, 2009.

1) **Bill for answering service:** Received a notice via e-mail from provider that our service would be discontinued if the bill is not paid by 04/16/08. I would request that the ASC make every possible effort to be sure this is paid on time so that the service is not lost.

2) **New RRAGS Meeting Directory Printing:** A reminder to the GSRs that the "Convention Edition" directories should be available at this ASC. Please get some for your groups.

3) **"Switch" Program:** NA has been invited to participate in a community information day for at risk youth, to take place on April 30, 2008 from 4-7 pm at the Millennium Center. PR has requested a table. It would be very important to have PR's directories and the previously outstanding literature order in hand by this date. I have zero (0) directories and other literature is running low. I will try to make arrangements to get these items.

4) **Mid-Month PR Subcommittee monthly meeting:** PR Subcommittee normally meets in conjunction with H&I on the third Saturday of every month. However, this month subcommittee meeting will be replaced by Phonline Learning Day at 11:00 am. (See below)
